growth and community building.

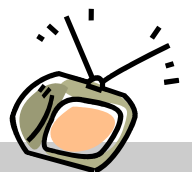
Archives to preserve the history of our previous parishes and further storage for a variety of energetic church groups.

## A Message from Fr. Selvin

### The meaning of the Advent wreath and the mystery of Nativity

There's discussion regarding the origin of the Advent wreath. Some say it began in pre-Christian Scandinavian customs. Others claim 16th-century Lutheranism for its' creation. Some say that the modern version of the Advent wreath initiated in Hamburg, Germany in 1839 from a Protestant pastor Johann Wichern. It slowly spread to other churches, including the Catholic Church, and other countries, reaching the United States in the 1930s. Whatever the truth of the origin, the wreath is a symbol that most Christian denominations can share and appreciate. The symbolism of the Advent wreath is quite beautiful. The circle of the wreath, with no beginning or end and made with evergreens, represents eternity and the everlasting life found in Christ.

The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent whose progressive lighting expresses the expectation and hope surrounding the coming of the Messiah. Week 1 evokes the patriarchs and the virtue of hope. Week 2 recalls the prophets and peace. Week 3 recalls John the Baptist and joy while Week 4 presents the figure of Mary and the virtue of love. If a fifth white candle is used, it naturally represents Christ, light of the world, and is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. In this beautiful time, when we experience the love of the Child Jesus, we make time to share with each other having fun by getting together. Some travel to other places to visit their family and friends. Wherever people go, they make sure that they attend Mass because we find that the Mass is very needed for all who know Jesus and try to live a life by example. Do not offend Jesus by getting into celebrations where there is too much drinks like alcohol, or too much wine. Everything with limits; the excess is coming from evil. Enjoy chocolate and any other kind of food. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

### Corona de Adviento y Navidad

Hay mucha discusión con respecto al origen de la corona de adviento. Algunos lo montan hasta la era pre-cristiana como

parte de las costumbres de Escandinavia. Otros dicen que en la edad media o por el siglo XVI en la época de la Reforma de Luterana protestante por su creación. Un experto investigador de historias y costumbres propone que la moderna versión de la corona de Adviento se inicio en Alemania, Hamburg, en 1839 como una iniciativa pastoral de Johann Hinrich Wichern pastor protestante (1808-1881). Poco a poco se fue expandiendo en todas las Iglesias incluyendo la Iglesia Católica, y en otros países llegando a Estados Unidos en el año 1930.

Como sea la verdad de su origen, la corona de adviento es un símbolo que la mayoría de cristianos pueden compartir y apreciar. El simbolismo de la corona de adviento es hermoso. La rueda de la corona, sin principio ni fin y hecho de verde, representa la eternidad y la vida eterna que se encuentra en Cristo.

Las cuatro velas representan las cuatro semanas de Adviento que progresivamente alumbrando se expresa la espera alrededor de la venida del Mesías. La primera semana evoca los patriarcas y la virtud de la esperanza. La 2da semana evoca los profetas y la paz. La 3ra semana nos recuerda a Juan Bautista y el gozo. La 4ta semana representa la figura de María. Otras formas de representar las semanas son también posiblemente proveído para concordar con el carácter del tiempo litúrgico de Adviento.

En este tiempo de Navidad, cuando experimentamos el amor y el gozo por celebrar el nacimiento del niño Jesús tengamos en cuenta que nosotros somos invitados a participar de esta fiesta; ya que es la fiesta de Jesús. En esta fiesta lo más bonito es que podemos compartir con familiares y amigos, pero es necesario evitar lo mas que se pueda bebidas alcohólicas para disfrutar de la fiesta y no ofender a Jesús en el día de su nacimiento. También es necesario asegurarse que ese día se atiende a misa para que la gracia del niño Jesús pueda derramarse en los corazones y vivir siempre feliz. Feliz Navidad y Prospero Año Nuevo

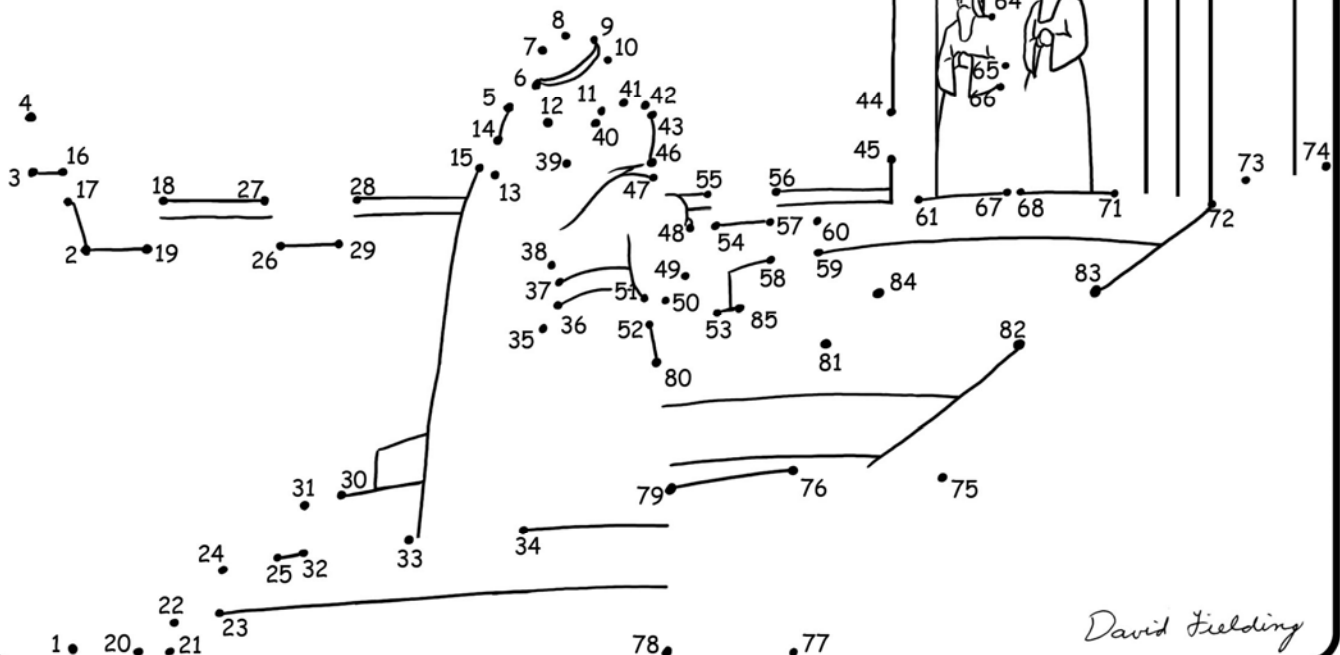
